DAY 1.

...we will focus on Participation in Arts and Culture in general

You will be introduced to the goals, methodologies and values of a series of projects and activities all dealing with different aspects of participation. During the presentations you will be able to choose which of the projects you want to join later for a more in-depth, hands-on participatory experience through workshops and guided tours.

After dinner you will be able to relax and party a little at an informal networking event in the Godsbanen Bar and Foyer. A smaller group will have the possibility of participating in the workshop Digital Dialogues. Of course you can simply go out and explore the many cultural activities that Aarhus as Cultural Capital 2017 has to offer.



DAY 2.

...we will concentrate on the results of the RECcORD Project.

The three researchers from Aarhus University – who have been working on this experimental project since early 2016 investigating participatory forms in European cultural centres – will try to answer some of the questions asked like; what kind of citizen involvement takes place in the cultural centers, and what are the potentials and effects of this citizen participation?

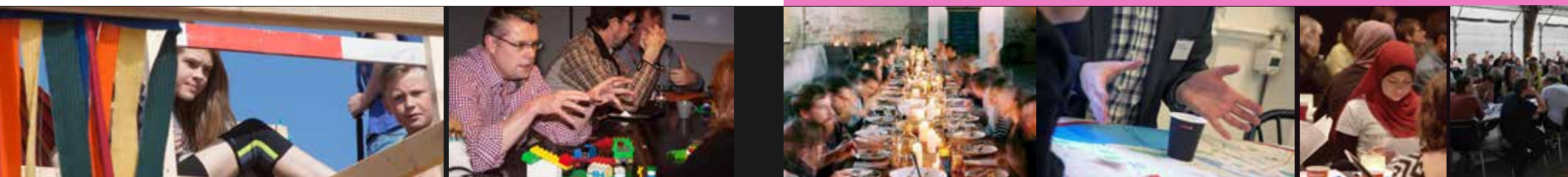
You can expect to be presented not only to new understandings of the concept of participation and to new descriptions of different participatory forms but also to the possible effects linked to the activities. After the presentation you have the opportunity to relate directly to the results through a session of Questions & Answers with the researchers and the floor.

Since the RECcORD project is not only about participation but also using participation as a methodology it includes an important learning process. It is important to understand how the theory and methods have been experienced in real life by the 20 Recorders who gathered all the information used by the researchers. Therefore the recorders – all being professionals from cultural centres in Europe – facilitate Informal Conversations about specific participatory forms that they have experienced and related to. It is up to you if you want join the conversations or maybe one of the other guided tours that you may have missed the day before.

In the afternoon a keynote speech will be presented by Dr. Leila Jancovich as an introduction to a larger Panel Debate on the subject of "Participation in Arts and Culture".

After the debate you will have a nice dinner in the Spiselauget Restaurant and Foyer and later you will have the opportunity to experience the amazing DRUM-KLUB event.

And.. of course again you also have the opportunity to explore Aarhus by night visiting one of the many events taking place in Aarhus as a part of the ECoC Aarhus 2017.



DAY 3.

...we will focus on the future and in order to understand the reality and conditions of the European cultural centres Peter Hessel Dahl will make a keynote speech introducing us to central Challenges and Possibilities for the European cultural centres.

Then we will dig a little deeper into real life situations by interviewing three representatives from the cultural centres who participated in the RECcORD project as hosting centres for the recorders. What's actually up and What's down? are some questions they will be asked.

This will lead us to the final Panel Debate and a discussion of the Challenges and Possibilities in European Cultural Centres. What do we know about the Cultural centres by now and what would we still like to know? What are the true obstacles for the development of participation in culture and arts, and how do we overcome them? These are some of the main issues to be talked about in the panel and in a Question & Answers session with you and the other participants.

Just before lunch we will try to sum up the event and the activities – and through your participation hopefully we will be able to sketch out new Visions for Cultural Centres in Europe.

HELLO!EARTH WORKSHOP

HelloEarth! will introduce their approach to working with participatory art works and share some of the methods they developed for audience participation both in the process of making art works and the final events/participatory performances.

They will demonstrate their methods through their current art work under development: "Dance your neighbour," to be premiered in September 2017.

"Dance your neighbour" is created through a series of workshops with diverse groups of people in a community, as well as interventions and actions in the neighbourhood. It evolves around keywords such as gathering, assembly and meetings with the body as vehicle for empathy.

In this workshop you get a taste of the working process and HelloEarth! will introduce their method of creating meetings through movement scores. The movement score is based on a story memory or experience of ones life. This score is given to another person, who is doing the movement. A meeting between people is evolving with base in the collective body that otherwise remains invisible.

GUIDED TOUR TO LOCAL COMMUNITY CENTRE

You are invited for a 20 minute walk to visit Beboernes Hus, Sølystgade – a small local community center, situated in an old workers area, now highly renewed and attractive resident area of Aarhus.

The community house is located in a part of an old bread factory, and is today hosting a variety of activities: meetings, concerts, poetry evenings, common dinners, yoga etc. On weekends the venues are rented out for parties weddings etc, which gives economy for running the house. Everything in planning, organising and administration is run by volunteers.

Your guide will be **THOMAS KRUSE**, a veteran from the days in the 70es where the residents in the area fought for playgrounds, safe traffic, meeting places etc. Today a senior Thomas takes active part in the local cultural life again.

BETWEEN GASTRONOMY AND RELATIONAL INVOLVEMENT TOGETHER STITCHING FOOD MEMORIES FROM MIGRANTS' CULINARY CULTURE

The term gastronomy is often misinterpreted, if comprehended at all as more than the taste or idea of consumption. However, gastronomy involves much more than food. It is the study of the relationship between food and almost every aspect of the human condition, making it a subject limitless in scope.



lIdstedet (i.e.: "The Fireplace") or "The Satellite Kitchen" works to establish a platform for our newcomer community; a platform of opportunities to engage in society in a meaningful and most important; dignified way; moreover a platform for an equitable exchange that enriches both the givers and the receivers.

It is also space for cultural global celebration, leaving a forum for sharing recipes and narratives. The Kitchen and the cooking are tools for intercultural integration and reunion, bridging the locals and the newcomers' cultures; here mostly the Syrian. The meetings and the strong encounters with new cultures, leave the newcomers with a confidence and optimism, which is of great value to the families as well as the community as a whole.

In this workshop you will prepare this evenings dinner for all the conference guests, guided by **ANNA OLINE LAUMARK**, **ISABELLA MARSCHALL** and their crew of Syrian refugees.

DIGITAL DIALOGUES: exploring the role of digital interfaces and tools in co-creating our sense of identity, heritage and visions for Europe's future

In this workshop, participants will get to experience and play with creative installations and digital interfaces for discussion, negotiation and reflection about what it means to be European.

CIID Research will bring digital prototypes that participants will use to express their opinions and that will encourage and mediate their discussion of sensitive topics related to the European Union.

The workshop will then facilitate a co-design session where participants create their own concepts for how they would like to encourage more open discussion and listening among their fellow workshop participants.

The workshop is led by **ANNELIE BERNER**, CIID, who is an interaction designer, teacher and data artist. She is especially interested in bridging and connecting across disciplines, often working through the medium of interactive and playful data visualisation.

CONVERSATIONS ABOUT PARTICIPATION

You will have the opportunity to take part in 'Conversations about participation' with the 'recorders' from the RECCORD project; the 20 different cultural workers from across Europe who have engaged in the project by making field studies about citizen participation in different European cultural centers. The recorders are ready to share their thoughts and experiences and thereby add the fieldworker's perspective on the research.

During the conversation, the conference participants will have the opportunity to participate; ask questions, share thoughts and their own experiences with the particular category. There will be six different conversations simultaneously, six different groups in Rå Hal – one dedicated to each category within the typology. And every conversation will start over three times. In that way you will be able to participate in three different 40-minutes-conversations divided by two small breaks.

RESEARCH

RECORD is a research and action project investigating cultural centres as arenas for citizen participation



DR. BIRGIT ERIKSSON is Associate Professor in Aesthetics and Culture at Aarhus University. She is co-director of a research programme in Cultural Transformations and director of Take Part - research network on cultural participation. She is the author, co-author or editor of numerous books and articles in Danish and English, including *Umberto Eco* (1995), *Patos?* (1998), *Smagskulturer og formidlingsformer* (2006), *Spændvidder: om kunst og kunstpolitik* (2010), *Æstetisering* (2012), *Moderne Dannelse* (2013), *Participation across institutional and disciplinary boundaries* (2016). Her current research focuses on participatory art and culture; cultural identities and citizenship; aesthetics and politics.



CARSTEN STAGE is Associate Professor in the School of Communication and Culture, Aarhus University, Denmark. Previous publications include *Global Media, Biopolitics, and Affect: Politicising Bodily Vulnerability* (co-authored with Britta Timm Knudsen, Routledge, 2015) and *Affective Methodologies: Developing Cultural Research Strategies for the Study of Affect* (co-ed, Palgrave, 2015). He is co-editor of the journal *Conjunctions: Transdisciplinary Journal of Cultural Participation* (www.conjunctions-tjcp.com/) and a member of the steering groups of the FKK-network *Take Part* and of the participation research project *Reccord*.



CAMILLA MØHRING REESTORFF is Associate Professor at the Department of Communication and Culture at the University of Aarhus and Honorary Research Fellow at the University of Melbourne. She is editor-in-chief of *Conjunctions. Transdisciplinary Journal of Cultural Participation* and director for *Center for Cultural Participation*. Her research focus include participation, activism, affect and cultural politics. She has recently published the book *Culture War: Affective Cultural Politics, Tepid Nationalism and Art Activism*.

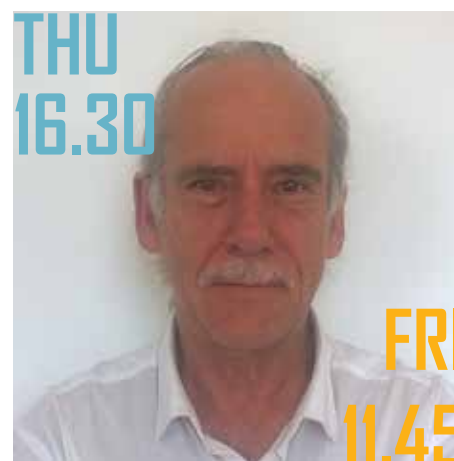

Davies was also the director of Copenhagen 96, Cultural Capital of Europe, and he led the bid for Aarhus to be European Capital of Culture in 2017. His first cultural position was as program manager for Huset, Aarhus, one of the first community arts centres in Scandinavia. He has also been director of The Aarhus Festival and The Salisbury Festival, UK and he set up the New Writing Center I Norwich, UK, now the UNESCO City of Literature.
